Plum Creek Awards \$3,000 to Catawba-Harmony Volunteer Fire Department

TOMAHAWK, Wis. – The Plum Creek Foundation today announced that it has awarded the Catawba-Harmony Volunteer Fire Department a \$3,000 grant to purchase a new 3,000-gallon tanker pump that will help serve Catawba and Harmony.

Terri Galinski, a Plum Creek forester, will present a check to the Catawba-Harmony Volunteer Fire Department at 9:30 a.m. on Oct. 24, at the fire hall in Catawba.

“We are pleased that Plum Creek supports our efforts to improve our fire department’s ability to respond to emergency situations in Catawba and Harmony,” said Fire Chief Mark Kempen. “With the new tanker pump, our volunteer fire department will be able to replace our old, tired tanker truck and better serve the residents in our community.”
