Plum Creek Awards \$1,270 to Price County Fair Association, Inc. for Portable Defibrillator

PHILLIPS, Wis. — The Plum Creek Foundation today announced that it has awarded a \$1,270 grant to the Price County Fair Association. The grant was used to purchase a Phillips Heart Start On-site Portable Public Access Defibrillator.

The 2006 Fair was held Thursday, Aug. 24, through Sunday, Aug. 27. With approximately 11,000 people in attendance at this year's Price County Fair, the defibrillator was available to be used to respond to emergency situations on the fairgrounds. In addition to the fair, the defibrillator will be available for use at the many other community activities held on the grounds throughout the year.

“We would like to thank Plum Creek for this grant, which has the potential to help save lives,” said Carol McLaughlin, vice president of the Price County Fair Association. “An on-site defibrillator will be a tremendous benefit to the thousands of people who come to the Price County Fair each year.
