Veterans of Foreign War Post 5723 Receives \$5,000 Plum Creek Foundation Grant for Veterans Memorial Monument

GREENVILLE, Maine – The Plum Creek Foundation recently awarded a \$5,000 grant to Veterans of Foreign War (VFW) Post 5723 to help fund the construction of a Veterans Memorial Monument.

The VFW Post 5723 is erecting a monument to honor all veterans of the United States armed forces, regardless of whether they served in conflict or not. The monument will be built in a small park next to the Veterans Memorial Bridge on the Moose River in Jackman, Maine. Community organizations, including the VFW and American Legion Posts of Jackman, city officials and the schools of Maine SAD #12, have helped organize funding and support for the project. Installation of the monument will begin in May 2008 and the monument will be dedicated on Memorial Day 2008.

“We are grateful to the Plum Creek Foundation for its support of this project,” said Harald Moore, quartermaster of VFW Post 5723. “We are proud to be able to create a memorial in the Jackman community dedicated to all of our nation’s veterans. This project is truly a tribute to all the veterans who have sacrificed for our country.”
